

Observation unit = play group

Zone, number of children (by age and by gender), supervised/not, type of play, description of play

Over 1400 playing children (3-14 years old) observed



Play index = #children observed playing / #children living in the neighbourhood






In 2008 we counted 45 girls among 100 children playing outdoors.



In 2019 we counted only 37 girls among 100 children playing outdoors.





RECREATIONAL SPACES!


There is a clear shift to spaces which are *meant* for recreation: playground, sports zones, bigger green spaces.

BUT STREET PLAY STILL MATTERS


To all ages, the street remains an important zone for play. More unsupervised play 'on the street' / in front of the front door.
